

CONCORD SVERIGES REMISSVAR RÖRANDE FÖRORDNINGEN OM FASTSTÄLLANDE AV EN UTGIFTSSPÅRNINGS- OCH PRESTATIONS RAM FÖR BUDGETEN SAMT ANDRA ÖVERGRIPANDE REGLER FÖR UNIONENS PROGRAM OCH VERKSAMHETER (COM(2025) 545 FINAL)

**Övergripande förslag (se konkreta ändringsförslag och kommentarer i tabellen nedan samt i separat bilaga för ändringsförslag som avser Annex 1 till förordningsförslaget):**

**Rörande horisontella principen för klimat och biologisk mångfald (Artikel 4) föreslår vi att:**

- Klimat- och miljöutgiftsmålet höjs till 50 %, med minst 10 % tillägnad biologisk mångfald;
- Att utgiftsmålen för klimat och miljö gäller för hela EU:s budget, i linje med kommissionens löfte att investera minst 700 miljarder euro i klimat och miljö;
- En robust spårningsmetod utvecklas för alla sex miljömålen, särskilt biologisk mångfald, för att uppfylla EU:s internationella åtaganden enligt konventionen om biologisk mångfald;

**Rörande horisontella principen för "Do No Significant Harm" för miljömålen (artikel 5) föreslår vi att:**

- Kryphål i tillämpningen av Do No Significant Harm-principen täpps till för att så långt som möjligt fasa ut skadlig verksamhet och helt fasa ut skadliga subventioner;
- Kriterier och principer för Do No Significant Harm utgår ifrån ett genusmedvetet/könsmedvetet förhållningssätt för att säkerställa att insatser inte förstärker könsdiskriminering och ojämställdhet;

**Rörande horisontella principen för jämställdhet (artikel 7) föreslår vi att:**

- Ambitionen för jämställdhetsintegrering stärks, jämställdhetsintegrering ska ske i alla policyområden och alla nivåer av genomförandet av EU-budgeten, i linje med EU:s jämställdhetsstrategi

- I detta avseende bör syftet med, och innebörden och ansvarsutkrävandet av jämställdhetsintegrering förtydligas. Om insatser är helt köns/genderblinda ska detta alltid medföljas av en förklaring tillsammans med en försäkran om att insatser inte bidrar till skada eller ökad diskriminering på grund av kön eller könsidentitet.

**Rörande ANNEX I - Intervention fields and indicators föreslår vi att:**

-Indikatorer som rör människor (till exempel number of farmers, smallholders, beneficiaries, people, etc.) ska vara disaggregerade i kön, ålder och funktionsnedsättning som minimum. Detta är helt nödvändigt för att kunna följa upp på insatsernas påverkan på olika kategorier av människor och följa upp den horisontella principen om jämställdhetsintegrering (Art 7 i COM(2025) 545). Utöver kön och ålder bör även flertalet indikatorer disaggregeras i andra relevanta underkategorier inklusive kris, migration och fördrivningsstatus (flykting, internflykting, etc.), inkomst/socio-ekonomisk status etc. Detta för att kunna säkerställa att EU:s insatser över olika policyområden bidrar till ökad jämlikhet och inkludering och motverkar exkludering och diskriminering.

- Indikatorerna listade i Annex 1 i större utsträckning reflekterar/anpassas till EU:s relationer med och insatser i tredje länder, i synnerhet till föreslagna insatser och specifika mål för Instrumentet för Europa i Världen/Global Europe (COM\_2025\_551\_final). I bifogat dokument föreslår vi konkreta tillägg och ändringar för att bättre integrera den externa dimensionen, men en ordentlig översyn över indikatorerna behövs för att säkerställa att EU:s samarbete med partnerländer är tillräckligt täck inom alla relevanta policyområden för att detta arbete ska kunna följas upp.

**Här nedan konkreta ändringsförslag till förordning om fastställande av en utgiftsspårings- och prestationsram för budgeten samt andra övergripande regler för unionens program och verksamheter (COM(2025) 545 final).**

<p>Article 4 – climate and biodiversity</p> <p>1. The contribution from the budget to climate and biodiversity shall be monitored by means of the budget expenditure tracking and performance framework laid down in Article 8, including by means of EU coefficients.</p> <p>2. Programmes and activities shall be implemented with a view to achieving an overall spending target of at least <b>35 50%</b> of the total amount of the budget on climate action and environmental objectives (‘climate and environment spending target’) over the entire 2028-2034 multiannual financial framework, calculated by using the highest coefficient amongst climate mitigation, climate adaptation and resilience, <b>water and marine resources, circular economy, pollution and environment biodiversity</b> of the framework referred to in paragraph 1. <b>As part of the climate and environment spending target, at least 10% of the total amount of the budget shall be spent on biodiversity objectives (‘biodiversity spending target’).</b></p> <p><del>Defence and security spending shall be excluded from the basis for the calculation of the climate and environment spending target.</del></p>	<p><i>Med tanke på ökande investeringsbehov, särskilt efter 2030, samt att målet inbegriper alla sex miljömålen, bör klimat- och miljöutgiftsmålet höjas till minst 50 %.</i></p> <p><i>Ett separat utgiftsmål för biologisk mångfald på 10 % bör införas för att säkerställa att tillräckliga klimat- och miljöinvesteringar dedikeras till biologisk mångfald. Erfarenheterna från faciliteten för återhämtning och motståndskraft (RRF) har tydligt visat att utan ett särskilt mål kommer begränsade resurser att allokeras till investeringar i biologisk mångfald (mindre än 2 % för hela RRF).</i></p>

3. EU programmes and instruments shall contribute to reaching the climate and environment spending **and the biodiversity spending target** defined in paragraph 2. The specific contribution of some EU programmes and instruments is laid out in Annex III.
4. The Commission is empowered to adopt delegated acts in accordance with Article 20 to adjust the levels of the climate and environment spending targets defined in Annex III to take into account developments during the implementation of the programmes, including the under- or over-achievement of the targets, or to reflect new priorities within the implementation of programmes with a view to achieving the overall climate and environment spending target and the biodiversity spending target over the entire 2028-2034 multiannual financial framework.
5. Where there is insufficient progress towards the climate and environment spending target or the biodiversity spending target in one or more of the relevant programmes, the Institutions, in accordance with their responsibilities and the relevant legislation, will consult each other on appropriate measures to be taken to ensure that Union spending on climate and environment objectives over the 2028-2034 multiannual financial framework corresponds to at least **35 50%** of the total amount of the Union budget **and that Union spending on biodiversity objectives corresponds to at least 10%**.

**The Institutions shall ensure that as part of the annual budgetary procedure at least 50% of the total annual amount of the budget is**

Where the actual, past contribution has been lower than the climate and environment spending target or the biodiversity target, the Institutions shall ensure that a higher share is dedicated in subsequent annual budgetary procedures with a view to achieving the targets over the entire 2028-2034 multiannual financial framework.</b></p>	
<p><u>Article 5 ‘Do no significant harm’ to environmental objectives</u></p> <p>1. A streamlined application of the ‘do no significant harm’ principle as referred to in Article 33(2), point (d), of Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2024/2509, shall be facilitated by a single and simple guidance (‘do no significant harm guidance’).</p> <p>2. The guidance referred to in paragraph 1 shall set out general <b>and gender-sensitive</b> principles and criteria and, where necessary, specific criteria at the level of relevant policy areas <b>and activities</b>.</p>	<p><i>Det är viktigt få in en jämställdhetsdimension i do-no harm begreppet för att säkerställa att insatser inte förstärker tex könsdiskriminering eller skadliga normer och strukturer som motarbetar jämställdhetsarbete eller till och med förstärker ojämställdhet.</i></p>

It shall distinguish, in particular, between policy areas **or and** activities that are always deemed to be in line with the do no significant harm principle, and policy areas **or and** activities that are considered to do significant harm to one or several environmental objectives and can therefore not be financed from the EU budget. **It shall notably identify policy areas and activities that are considered to be particularly harmful and can therefore not be financed from the EU budget, even if pursuant to paragraph 3 the do no significant harm principle is not fully applied.**

The guidance by the Commission shall take into account the need to achieve the set objectives of the relevant programmes or instruments in line with the Union's policy priorities, the need to avoid duplication with requirements under existing EU legislation, the high levels of protection to human health and the environment provided by existing EU legislation, the administrative and reporting burden on authorities and beneficiaries, and the principle of proportionality.

Proportionality shall be ensured **notably** by taking into account the size of an activity, **its climate and environmental impacts**, and the territorial characteristics of the regions where the activities take place or the fact that they may take place in third countries, **and notably its climate and environmental impacts.**

<p><u>Article 7 Gender equality</u></p> <p><b>1. Gender equality mainstreaming is a critical objective for the EU. As stated in the Gender Equality Strategy, the aim of gender mainstreaming is to redistribute power, influence and resources in a fair and gender-equal way, tackling inequality, promoting fairness, and creating opportunity.</b></p> <p><b>1. **intervention: preparation, design, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of policies, regulatory measures and spending programmes. In the case of the Multiannual Financial Framework, it will mean adopting the following steps:**

- **Analysing budgets of relevant instruments from a gender perspective**
- **Developing gender equality objectives for each of these instruments**
- **Implementing programmes with a gender equality lens and based on a gender analysis**
- **Monitoring, evaluation and feedback into the next cycle with a gender equality lens**

1. **TER** The programmes and activities that aim to support gender equality in accordance with Article 33(2), point (f), of Regulation (EU, Euratom) 2024/2509 are specified in Annex IV to this Regulation.

All programmes and activities shall pay particular attention to ensuring, to the extent possible, gender balance in evaluation panels and other relevant advisory bodies such as boards, expert groups and monitoring committees.

2. For the purpose of the gender equality mainstreaming methodology referred to in Article 33(2), point (f), of Regulation (EU, Euratom)

2024/2509, activities of the budget shall fall into one of the following categories and corresponding gender equality scores:

- (a) activities with gender equality as a principal objective ('gender equality score 2');
- (b) activities with gender equality as an important and deliberate objective but not as its main objective ('gender equality score 1');
- (c) activities anticipated to have no substantial contribution to gender equality ('gender equality score 0'). **Gender-blind activities must be duly justified, robust reasons should be given to explain why an activity does not contribute to gender equality and evidence that this activity will do no harm to gender equality must be shown.**

The activities referred to in the second subparagraph shall be defined by reference to the list of intervention fields set out in Annex I.

3. The Commission shall provide technical guidance on the methodology referred to in paragraph 2 to determine the categories and corresponding gender equality scores, aiming to ensure consistency across all programmes.

4. The Commission is empowered to adopt delegated acts in accordance with Article 20 to amend Annex IV.
